As taxi drivers, we get very little support from licensing or the local police, why would they want to get involved with something that could potentially leave them vulnerable?

The best way to safeguard passengers & drivers would be CCTV with audio.

On the whole, I am in support for any initiative to improve both the reputation & safety of the Taxi Trade.

Thank you for taking the time to reply and please see my reply to the issues you have raised.

The training will more than likely be an on line course which can be undertaken at home or anywhere where you can obtain an internet connection. If need be we will be able to provide help to those who do not have access to the internet.

There will be no additional cost for undertaking the training.

The training will be aimed at ensuring that the driver is fully equipped with dealing with safeguarding issues. Over the past couple of years there has been a number of high profile safeguarding cases which have involved taxi drivers. It is therefore essential that the council, as a part of their assessment of ensuring a person is fit an proper to hold a licence that this training is undertaken. The training will not only ensure that the passengers are safe but as important we need to ensure that all drivers are fully equipped to deal and identify issues should they arise while driving a taxi.

I do not quite understand some of your comments regarding testifying etc. If an incident happened now they would still need to provide statements etc to the police, which could ultimately result in giving evidence. Drivers currently are extremely vulnerable; the training will hopefully provide them with additional skills to deal with safeguarding incidents if they were to happen.

Currently you are able to put CCTV in your vehicles following approval from ourselves; however a recent case involving Southampton City Council ruled that audio cannot be used.

I'm writing to you in response to your letter dated 30th September and your request for my opinion on safeguarding training.

My thoughts on this are how does the Isle of Wight Council (IOW) hope to achieve the safety of passengers with safeguarding training of taxi drivers? I cannot recall any occasions that high profile safeguarding issues have occurred on the Island. Is the purpose of this proposed training meant to raise awareness of the various types of abuse and associated indicators, with the subsequent reporting procedures?

It's plainly wrong in my opinion to assume that taxi drivers are going to be equipped adequately to spot abuse by taking a one day, or online safeguarding course.

What would be the legal consequences of a taxi driver mistakenly reporting what he/she thought was abuse incorrectly?

Is a taxi driver the sort of person who should be taking on the complex assessment of a situation in what normally is a 15-20 minute taxi journey? There are certain professions in everyday life that have a statutory responsibility to report the different types of abuse and their indicators, taxi drivers are not among them. One could argue that we all have a moral responsibility to report, but isn't that opening a whole new can of worms?

And finally how does the Council propose to finance these courses or do they expect the drivers themselves to pay for the training?

Licensing Reply 7 October 2015

Thank you for taking time to provide me with you thoughts.

There have been a number of high profile cases nationally where taxi drivers have been part of large scale exploitation and sexual offences cases. Local authorities are being urged to ensure that all drivers have an understanding and awareness of safeguarding issues. The training course being proposed will help heighten the awareness and provide some help to drivers if they are confronted with issues. The training will not mean that they are fully qualified in child protection issues and we are certainly not expecting them to become case workers. We just need to ensure that they are aware of the signs and know how to report them properly.

The training will be web based and will be included within the current fee.

I hope this addresses any concerns you have.
