Dear Ms Bull

Thank you so much for taking the time to get back to me and advising me about what is, and what is not, allowable for consideration. However, I must now content myself with the knowledge that I have informed your department of the background to this case and how things are, and the panel will not be going into the hearing in ignorance of the full facts.

I would like to beg your indulgence in asking you to also take into consideration one further fact I had not previously put into my objection letter; that is there is a planned installation of a 72" television screen in the upstairs of the property with regular public showings of the national and international football matches, other sporting events etc. The blaring of the TV, alongside excitable and noisy drinkers, through the open windows overlooking the wildlife park, overlooking our house and garden and overlooking neighbouring houses and gardens, will render the noise INTOLERABLE. The sound from indoors travels far more from the upstairs of properties, as it is, and this will be adding to the noise of the outside drinking community on the noisy decking area, if the license is approved. I cannot overstate that fact that sound really is amplified in this area. No-one could, for one moment, consider this situation and the likely noise and nuisance to be comparable to the normal activity and noise emanating from another single residential dwelling on that site. This is, as I have said before, a small residential complex in a protected rural environment. At present, the only sound amplified is birdsong and the odd footfall and car passing by. If this becomes a drinking establishment, outside the jurisdiction of the local police on the public highway, our current way of life will be over and everyone's quality of life round here will be diminished. Please see below the pictures I originally meant to send. The first is from a side elevation. The windows actually look straight into our house and out and over our garden, from the front; the building is just five metres from our boundary and just over two metres from the public bridle-path which runs alongside our fence.
