Subject Licensing Act 2003 ("The Act")

Application for a Grant of Premises Licence

The 1st Floor, 4 Chain Lane, Newport, Isle of Wight, PO30 5QA

By virtue of Section 13 (4)(c)and 13 (4)(e), Environmental Health is a responsible authority and may make representations to the Licensing Authority over applications for Premises Licences.

It is concerned that the applicant has not adequately addressed the licensing objectives for control of public nuisance in the Operating Schedule as required under section 17(4)(g) of the Act. I feel that the completed section M d) of the application is non-specific and not particularly detailed.

There are residential properties within close proximity of the premises and there is the potential for public nuisance to be caused due to noise both from the playing of live and recorded music and also customers.

In order to protect local residents I recommend the inclusion of the following condition to any licence granted:

"No licensable activities are permitted under this licence unless a Noise Management Plan has been submitted to and agreed in writing with the local Licensing Authority and once approved, the plan (and any subsequent approved version of the plan) is adhered to at all times. Any changes of circumstances (in relation to noise output from the premises and its control) must be reflected in the Noise Management Plan and a written request for an amendment must be submitted to the local Licensing Authority for further approval. The Noise Management Plan shall be reviewed at any time upon request from the local Licensing Authority and resubmitted for approval."
