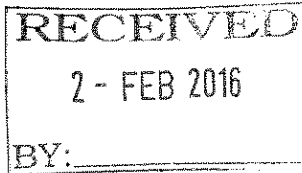

As a tenant of a beach hut at Dunroamin Beach, we wish to object to the granting of an alcohol licence to Tradewinds Café on the following grounds:

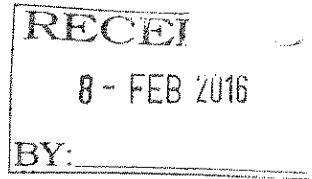
1. Lack of toilet facilities. We already have problems with people using the rear of our huts as a toilet, this will get far worse.

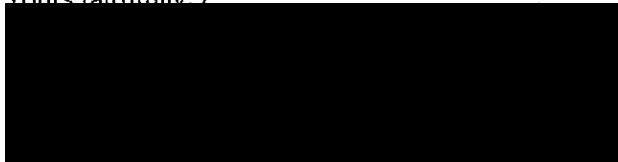

As we rent a beach hut the last thing we want to put up with is the smell of human waste as we try to enjoy a sunny day at the seafront.

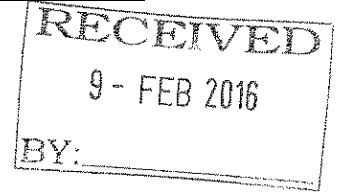
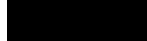

Subject : Alcohol Licence for Tradewinds Café, Dunroanin Beach Lake

I am writing to object to the planned alcohol licence for The Tradewinds Café at Dunoanin Beach Lake. My main objections are :

- The café does not have its own toilets therefore if it is open later at night when all the beach hut owners have gone home their clientele will be going behind the beach huts to urinate possibly even something more sinister. As a beach hut owner I find the thought of this appalling. The nearest toilets are a good five minute walk away and I doubt that many people will take the trouble to walk to them if indeed they will be open late at night. I cannot bare to think about the smell which would eventually ensue.
- Regularly damage is already caused to the beach huts, only a couple of weeks ago doors were kicked in during the night and my fear is that this could be more prevalent if people are a little drunk.
- With drunkenness often comes vomiting and I would find it particularly unpleasant to arrive for the day one morning to find I have vomit to clear up. This along with the regular dog poo that we find on a daily basis would be totally unacceptable.

In short I am concerned about the treatment of the space and the beach huts that we pay a lot of money per year to enjoy and am very concerned that this enjoyment will be taken away from us.
