Suggested Police Conditions for Noodle Pot, 91A St James Street, Newport, Isle of Wight, po30 1LB

- 1. Public are not permitted inside the premises from 23:00 hours until close.
- 2. A log book shall be kept on the premises by the Premises Licence Holder, which shall contain the following details:
- (a) the door supervisor's name
- (b) his/her SIA licence number
- (c) the time and date he/she starts and finishes duty
- (d) each entry shall be signed by the door supervisor

The log book shall be immediately available for inspection on demand by an authorised officer of the Council, the SIA or the police.

- 3. Where engaged at the premises door supervisors shall take all practicable steps to;
- (a) Remove bottles and glass vessels from those queuing for food.
- (b) Challenge any drunken or anti-social behaviour by customers.
- (c) Maintain order within the queue and encourage customers who have been served to move away from the area.
- (d) Encourage customers on leaving to do so in a quiet, orderly manner.
- 4. SIA registered door supervisors shall wear high visibility jackets at all times whilst on duty.
- 5. A written record shall be made of every incident of crime and disorder taking place on or outside of the premises, to include any action taken by staff. Every entry in the record shall be signed and dated by the person making it. This record shall be produced to a police officer or an authorised officer of the local authority on reasonable request.
- 6. A prominent, clear and legible notice shall be displayed requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents by leaving the premises and the area quietly.
- 7. Unless they are in the queue waiting for service, all reasonable steps will be taken to ensure that customers do not congregate in the street in the immediate vicinity of the premises such as to cause public nuisance at any time.
- 8. An appropriate queuing system shall be used during licensable activity. Prominent, clear, legible signage must be provided to ensure that customers are aware of the way in which the queuing system operates.
- 9. The queue will be postioned to allow pedestrians continued use of the pavement and keep customers away from any parked vehicles.
- 10. Any area used by customers to queue shall be well lit.

11. A CCTV system shall be installed and maintained to the satisfaction of police and the licensing authority. The system shall operate at all times the premises are open to the public and shall provide coverage of every public entrance or exit and any area used by the public to queue for late night refreshment. Recorded images shall be of sufficient clarity to allow personal identification, and shall display the correct time and date of the recording. A member of staff capable of operating the CCTV system shall be present at all times the premises are open to the public. The system shall be capable of exporting recorded images to removable media (eg CD/DVD) and be capable of the replaying of footage for review. CCTV footage shall be retained for a period of at least 30 days and be produced to a police officer or responsible officer of the local authority on reasonable request.
