



The Chief officer of police makes representations with regards to this application under all four of the licensing objectives.

The premises licence was received on the 12th March 2019. It related to the use of the Duxmore Farm, Downend, Newport to hold a music event called Dick and Dom's great wonderfest and great wonder camp for up to 15 000 people from 29th July to 5th August 2019.

It was accompanied by a number of supporting documents including an E.M.P. security plan and bar staff training summary amongst others.

The consultation period for this application was initially due to conclude on the 8th April 2019.

Due to non-compliance with the advertising of the application the consultation period had been restarted and would now conclude on 22nd April 2019.

There had been no consultation with the police prior to the submission of this application.

It quickly became clear from the accompanying documents that they were very generic, and although some changes had been made to identify them as relating to this event, there were quite a few references to other events and to staff members who had nothing to do with this event.

Certain policies and procedures might be the same for a number of different events, and the use of generic documents to cover these policies from one event to another may be expedient. However each event will be different as will be the staff involved. All documents detailing policies and procedures should be tailored for each event and care, attention to detail and due diligence should be shown before submitting such documentation.

It was therefore concerning to see that very little effort seemed to have been made to ensure that the documents were fit for purpose prior to their submission. The most glaring example of this was that staff were instructed to report any suspicious packages relating to a possible terrorist threat to a person who had nothing to do with this event and had previously worked with the applicants at an event in 2017.

A full list of observations, questions and recommendations was created by P.C. Bradley after reading each of the accompanying documents. This document, produced as Appendix 1 also highlights the catalogue of errors contained within them.

A meeting was arranged with the applicants to try and raise and address concerns about this and another event they were organising. The meeting took place on the 8th April. Appendix 1 was only part completed at this time but the concerns so far listed were shared with the organisers. Following the meeting it was completed and forwarded to them later that day.

The organisers have confirmed with council licensing that they will be looking to hold a meeting on the 18th April to address concerns raised by the responsible authorities and at the latest would look to respond by the 23rd April, the day after the consultation period finishes.

It is the view of the Chief Officer of Police that it will not be possible to adequately assess any response that might be forthcoming from the applicant and agree suitable conditions within the statutory consultation period.

In some cases conditions can be agreed prior to the end of the consultation period which effectively make submission of an agreed E.M.P. within a set period of time prior to the event and the contents of that E.M.P. conditions of the licence. However due to the short period of time remaining it is doubtful that even this would be achievable.

There may also be measures which require to be highlighted through separate conditioning in the licence. And until such time as the questions raised to the applicants have been answered, applying appropriate conditions will not be possible.

And unfortunately the organisers approach to the submission of accurate documents in a timely fashion so far during the application process has not given the Chief Officer of police confidence that once granted a licence, they will view it as a priority.

It is an offence, under section 158 of the Licensing Act 2003 to make a false statement in or in connection with this representation


