Annex 1

Mandatory Conditions

(Where the Premises Licence authorises the supply of alcohol)

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

- d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event process, or
 - ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. 1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
7. The responsible person shall ensure that—
- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

(Where the Premises Licence authorises the exhibition of films)

8. Admission of children to the exhibition of any film is to be restricted in accordance with Section 20.

(Where the Premises Licence includes a condition that door supervisors must be used)

9. All security personnel must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 **Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**

1. Intoxicated persons are not permitted on the premises.
2. The premises are to be kept well lit.
3. After 2400 hours on any day all movable tables and chairs and similar furniture shall be removed or made unavailable for use if fixed and immovable, from customer areas.
4. A CCTV system shall be installed and maintained to the satisfaction of police and the local authority. The system shall operate at all times the premises is open to the public and shall provide coverage of the public entrance, the servery and every area for use by customers. Recorded images shall display the correct time and date of the recording. The system shall be capable of exporting images to removable media and be capable of replaying the footage for review. A member of staff capable of operating the CCTV system shall be available to replay CCTV footage to a police officer upon reasonable request and, in any case, within 24 hours of such a request. CCTV footage shall be retained for a period of at least 30 days and shall be provided to a police officer on reasonable request.
5. Notices will be clearly displayed at the entrance to, and prominently within the premises advising that CCTV is in operation on the premises.
6. An incident book must be maintained containing all instances of public disorder, including ejection of patrons and fighting on the premises or any matter that requires police attendance. The book will be kept on the premises at all times and must be made available for inspection by an authorised officer of the licensing authority and the police
7. Customer will not be allowed to congregate in the street in the immediate vicinity of the premises such as to cause public nuisance at any time.
8. Steps will be taken to discourage patrons from eating and drinking immediately outside the premises after 2300hours
9. Clear signage will be displayed at the exit requesting customers leave in a quiet, orderly manner.
10. Steps will be taken to impose a system to manage orderly queuing within the premises at times of high customer numbers.
