The Care Quality Commission (CQC) undertook an inspection in November 2016 of various services provided by the IWNHS Trust. The resulted in the Trust being rated as inadequate and being placed into special measures by NHS Improvement. The Trust has produced an improvement plan detailing the actions to be taken to address the findings of the CQC. (Paper C)

In looking at developing the workplan members should be aware of the items included within Healthwatch Isle of Wight's programme for 2017/18. This is intended to avoid any duplication and ensure the effective use of the resources available. The items proposed by Healthwatch are :-

a) Adult Mental Health Services

This came top in Healthwatch's annual prioritisation survey and remains a firm priority for local people. Following a poor inspection rating from the Care Quality Commission, our local mental health services are undergoing transformation. Healthwatch will be speaking to people who are using services to ensure that their care has improved.

b) 111 and Out of Hours GP Services

Now that the Isle of Wight does not have a GP- led walk in centre, the use of the 111 system will become ever more essential for people looking at accessing speedy information and advice about healthcare. Healthwatch will be looking at this service to identify what works well and which areas need improving.

c) Social Work Services

Healthwatch receive a high level of feedback around social work services, particularly around the support of people who fund their own care. It will looking at this service in more depth in the forthcoming year.

d) Ambulance Service

The Isle of Wight NHS Trust ambulance service was recently rated as inadequate. Healthwatch will be reviewing the feedback that it has received about this service to enable it to define the focus of the work in this area.

e) Dementia Care

The Isle of Wight had the highest recorded prevalence of dementia in the UK for 2011/12 and this is mainly due to the higher than average population of older people who live on the Island. It will be working with service providers and commissioners to improve the experience of people with dementia by listening to people, their families and carers about their experience of living with the condition

<u>Interests</u>

If there is a matter on this agenda which may relate to an interest you or your partner or spouse has or one you have disclosed in your register of interests, you must declare your interest before the matter is discussed or when your interest becomes apparent. If the matter relates to an interest in your register of pecuniary interests then you must take no part in its consideration and you must leave the room for that item. Should you wish to participate as a member of the public to express your views where public speaking is allowed under the Council's normal procedures, then you will need to seek a dispensation to do so. Dispensations are considered by the Monitoring Officer following the submission of a written request. Dispensations may take up to 2 weeks to be granted.

Members are reminded that it is a requirement of the Code of Conduct that they should also keep their written Register of Interests up to date. Any changes to the interests recorded on that form should be made as soon as reasonably practicable, and within 28 days of the change. A change would be necessary if, for example, your employment changes, you move house or acquire any new property or land.
