Reduce Reoffending	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Youth Offending Team have relaunched their Priority Young Offenders (PYP) Scheme and Youth Crime Prevention (YCP) There is historical evidence that both schemes have proven to be a significant factor of entrance into criminal justice system and reoffending rates.</li> <li>Youth Reoffending Task and Finish Group held to take forward a partnership approach to reducing youth reoffending.</li> <li>National Association Care and Resettlement of Offenders (NACRO) are now delivering the Liaison and Diversion service on the Island to tackle the needs of offenders which will reduce reoffending this includes support with the following: housing, substance misuse, employment, community participation and volunteering.</li> </ul>	<p>Reducing reoffending group chaired by Head of Youth Offending, to finalise the delivery plan and identify resources to deliver diversion and positive activities.</p>

Reduce violent crime	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Violent Crime Workshop held, partners identified priorities and actions to tackle: drug related harm, alcohol related public place violence.</li> <li>Schools engaged with violence reduction and restorative justice projects with visits from positive role models who motivate the prevention of young people's engagement in violent crime.</li> <li>Operation sceptre carried out to tackle knife crime</li> <li>Policing approach to drug-related harm on IOW now includes operational response from partner agencies in the management of vulnerability.</li> </ul>	<p>Structured Safe4me programme to be delivered at all IOW Secondary Schools</p> <p>Operation Fortress to be launched with partners to reduce drug related harm and crime A partnership meeting to develop a tactical approach to reducing crime will be launched in the summer Of 2019.</p>

The events were carried out by Community Safety Partners in locations with high footfall including leisure centre and supermarkets. Approximately 100 to 200 members of the public at each event had been advised of the survey and encouraged to 'have their say about ASB, crime and disorder'.</li> <li>• Community Safety partners carried out four street mapping surveys in ASB hot spots to promote community engagement and awareness and gather information to tackle ASB.</li> <li>• Partnership training delivered on wider use of community protection notices and ASB tools and powers</li> </ul>	<p>Third party reporting centres Hate crime awareness week Crime prevention and awareness community safety events Operation Refuge will be launched to tackle street drinkers.</p>
