# 1) PREABLE

- a) VTG considered its response to the consultation that had been launched on 7 September at its meeting of 14 September 2015 and resolved to establish a Work Group of five Town Councillors and the Clerks to consider the background information supplied and the case studies incorporated in it in detail and asked it to report back to the next Town Council meeting.
- b) The Work Group met on 5 October with all Members having familiarised themselves with the information in the meantime and arrived at a unanimous recommendation to the Town Council meeting of 12 October that:
  - i) none of the options set out in the consultation be supported; and
  - the Isle of Wight Council be informed that notwithstanding the seriousness of the its predicted Budget deficit for 2016/17, savings that affect only residents on low incomes are unacceptable.

### 2) ASSESSMENT

- a) The Work Group's recommendation, and the context of it, were assessed at the Town Council Meeting of 12 October 2015 and the draft Minutes of that discussion are recorded here to convey the essence of the discussion:
  - The Mayor introduced the item in his role as Chair of the Work Group appointed by the September
    meeting of the Town Council to consider a response to the Isle of Wight Council's current
    consultation on options for making savings in its Local Council Tax Scheme and whose
    recommendations were recorded in Report 86/15.
  - Councillor Ed Gouge shared the Group's concerns about the impact on low income families of all the proposed options in the consultation.
  - Councillor Ken Knapman added that as a member of the Group he could not be part of supporting any of the options given the inevitable impact on many people already struggling to maintain a reasonable standard of living.
  - Councillor Tony Marvin said that he agreed with what had been said but asked if any possible
    positive proposals could be made to assist the Isle of Wight Council to close its Budget gap by other
    means.
  - Councillor Harry Rees asked that the Town Council's view be shared with both the Isle of Wight Association of Local Councils and the Island's MP.
  - Councillor Steve Stubbings said he wanted to thank the Town Council for giving such serious consideration to the consultation and that he was anticipating with concern the government's Annual Statement of 25 November.
- b) With the exception of Councillor Steve Stubbings, who had declared an interest, the Work Group's recommendation was unanimously endorsed by the full Council.

## 3) RESPONSE

Consequently, we ask that this be accepted as Ventnor Town Council's formal response to the consultation on the Council Tax Reduction Scheme 2016/17, namely that none of the Options are supported as savings that only target residents with low incomes are unacceptable.
