Background/Context:	The Better Care Fund (BCF) is a single pooled budget for health and social care services which has been created nationally to drive to drive integrated health and adult social care services through greater integrated commissioning and which includes the Improved Better Care Fund (iBCF).  In March, the government confirmed additional funding for social care to be paid		
	directly to local authorities as part of an expanded Improved Better Care Fund grant (iBCF). The grant has three purposes:		
	Meeting adult social care needs.		
	<ul> <li>Reducing pressures on the NHS, including supporting people to be discharged from hospital when they are ready.</li> </ul>		
	Ensuring the local social care market is supported.		
	The IOW Better Care Fund (BCF) Plan 2017-19, submitted 19th September 2017 and fully assured in October 2017, sets out how the CCG and Isle of Wight Council will meet the national BCF and iBCF requirements for 2017/19.  The iBCF grant conditions included a requirement to report quarterly to the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG). A Q1 iBCF report was submitted to DCLG in September 2017. Due to the delayed submission date, there was not a requirement for a Q1 Report to be submitted to NHS England.  For Quarters 2, 3 & 4 2017/18, Quarterly Reports are required to be submitted both to the DCLG and to NHS England.

Strategic Alignment:	The BCF plan supports the delivery of the Hampshire and IOW Sustainability and Transformation Plans, the Next Steps on the NHS Five Year Forward View, the IOW Local Care Plan, The Urgent and Emergency Care Delivery Plan and our delivery of the MLAFL Vision.

Financial Impact:	The council and the CCG are proposing a total Better Care Fund (including iBCF) of £35.878m for 2017-18 and £36.187m for 2018-19. The value was £31.332m in 2016/17  The iBCF allocation for the Isle of Wight is as follows:  2017/18 £3.254m 2018/19 £2.175m 2019/20 £1.081m
