

West Wight School Places Consultation.

Alternative Options submitted:

[Note: Some options suggest federation and then relocation. School Organisation Regulations do not allow this as you are still required to close one or more of the schools involved.]

a) Close / Federate All Saints' CE Primary with Yarmouth / Shalfleet CE Primary federation, increase the size of Yarmouth to one form entry and relocate it on to the All Saints' site.	
Pros	Cons

b) Federate All Saints' with Brighstone CE Primary retaining a smaller school on the All Saints' site. Re-purpose parts of the All Saints' site not required.

c) Federate All Saints' with St Saviour's to provide a new multi-faith one form entry school on the All Saints' site.

d) Change the leadership at All Saints', reduce its size and re-purpose those parts of the school not required.

e) Close Brighstone Primary and move the students to All Saints' creating a one form entry school. Find alternate uses for the Brighstone site.

f) Close Yarmouth CE Primary School and move the pupils to All Saints' CE Primary creating a one form entry school. Find alternate uses for the Yarmouth site.

g) Federate all the CE schools in West Wight and keep All Saints' open.

h) Close St Saviour's and All Saints' and build a new one form entry school elsewhere in Freshwater. It could be a multi-faith, CE, Catholic or non-faith school.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Retains a school provision in Freshwater ▪ Reduces total number of school places available in West Wight; ▪ Releases St Savours and All Saints' site for other uses ▪ New primary school could be non-faith giving new option for community 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ No other site owned by Diocese or IW Council has been identified. ▪ If new primary was non-faith, loses Catholic option for community ▪ Significant capital investment required ▪ Closure of an Ofsted 'good' and popular school which is near to fully subscribed ▪ Loss of PSBP2 funding at All Saints site ▪ Timing may prove difficult to manage, children current on roll at ASPs may leave and go elsewhere

i) Close St Saviour's, All Saints' and Yarmouth and build a new two form entry school on the All Saints' site. It could be a multi-faith, CE, Catholic or non-faith school.	
Pros	Cons
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Retains a school provision in Freshwater ▪ Reduces total number of school places available in West Wight (only nominally, total PAN now is only 65 and from next year it is 50) ▪ PSBP2 funding at All Saints' site can be retained ▪ Greater financial viability of a 2fe school ▪ Releases Yarmouth and St Saviour's sites for future educational or other use 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ If new school was CE or non-faith removes the catholic option for the community ▪ Breaks the link between St Saviour's and its local church ▪ No funding identified to build new 2fe school ▪ Closure of 2 Ofsted 'good' schools ▪ Less parental choice for Schools in West Wight

j) Close All Saints' and re-open Totland Primary.	
Pros	Cons
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Totland Primary closed in 2004 ▪ If reference means Weston Academy which closed in 2015. Site is on split levels, not suitable at all. ▪ Loss of PSBP2 funding at All Saints' site ▪ Timing may prove difficult to manage, children current on roll at ASPs may leave and go elsewhere

k) Defer closure to Sept 2020 and allow All Saints to improve	
Pros	Cons
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Does not manage the immediate issues around surplus capacity ▪ Fails to address the on-going standards issues ▪ Leaves five schools in the West Wight
