Background	The committee have expressed concerns regarding cross Solent ferry operations as the services provided by the ferry operators have a direct impact on the economy and residents of the Island.  Isle of Wight ferry services play a pivotal role in the transport of people and goods between the Island and the mainland. As there are no scheduled air services or a fixed link the Island is dependent on its ferry links with the mainland for the delivery of, or access to, many essential goods and services.  Island residents use the ferries to travel for work, family, health, and social reasons and can be impacted by high fares and disruption to services.  The Isle of Wight Council is the Local Transport Authority for the Island. Decision making for major transport infrastructure spending is devolved to these bodies from the Department for Transport.
