Churchman Vanessa	<p>I am seriously concerned that we have a shortfall of members on the different committees and have thought a lot about it. Listed below are some positive ideas to address this: (1) Reduce each committee to 6 members. Apart from the main scrutiny committee. Each of the others is chaired by a member of the ruling group so as to the Chair always has the casting vote this keeps control within the group. (2) Reduces the Committees to 5 members so as to retain overall control. However this may not work out across the whole 40 (soon to be 39) with regard to proportionality amongst the opposition. (3) Reduce the number of cabinet members to 8. (4) Reduce Planning committee to 8. If we wish to recruit new councillors and expect them to last eight years rather than four then we need to allow for the following: (a) some elected members have full time jobs and we cannot expect them to sit on more than one committee. We need these councillors so as to keep a balanced administration. (b) Councillors now seem to be busier than ever, partly through all the stuff that comes down from central government and the increased expectations that the public have of their elected members. (c) Our council staff have been pared to the bone and I have found that I need to do more. (d) There will always be some members who do not "sit on anything" but it has never been any different. I haven't worked out the figures for my first two suggestions but as we are struggling with 25 (26) at the moment as the ruling group, I would suspect that the Const would need to acknowledge that if the leading group had a majority of 24/25 then either 1 or 2 above should be applied. However if cabinet members were reduced plus planning down to 8 this would help.</p>
