

**THE ISLE OF WIGHT COUNCIL (VARIOUS STREETS, NETTLESTONE)  
(TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER NO 1 2021**

Notice is hereby given that the Isle of Wight Council in exercise of their powers under section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act' of 1984), the Road Traffic Act 1991 ("the Act of 1991") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with The Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 8 to the Act of 1984 propose to make an order the effect of which will be to:

1. To enact the provisions contained therein subject to the following amendments:

- a. To Introduce 'No Waiting at Any Time' in the following lengths of road: Seaview Lane, on the west side, from a point 39.5 metres north to a point 110.5 metres south of its junction with Rowantree Drive.

- Seaview Lane, on the east side, from a point 39.5 metres north to a point 48 metres south of its junction with Rowantree Drive.

- Rowantree Drive, on both sides, from its junction with Seaview Lane to a point 12.5 metres east thereof.

The amendments are being proposed for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, and for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians), following proposals for a new development.

A copy of the draft Order, this Notice and the relevant plan may be inspected between normal office hours at the Customer Service Centre, County Hall, Newport, Isle of Wight during the objection period.
